The Highly invasive Japanese knotweed had completely taken over so Lawrence researched and then purchased a wire mesh that he put down to keep it from growing.








The Elaine and Philip Beals Preserve

Trustees Larry Samberg, Lawrence Spezzano and Matt Morris remove a large fallen tree from the Hickory Trail




Trail maintenance often requires making the water go where you need it to go.

Seepage from the upper pasture caused chronic mud along the Old Farm Lane through the spring and early summer. Trustees Larry and Eileen Samberg consulted with Conservation Works LLC who proposed a system of mesh, rock, gravel, and sand for a stable raised path.

Cassie Melo made two benches for her Eagle Scout project and had a little help from Whit Beals getting them in place.





