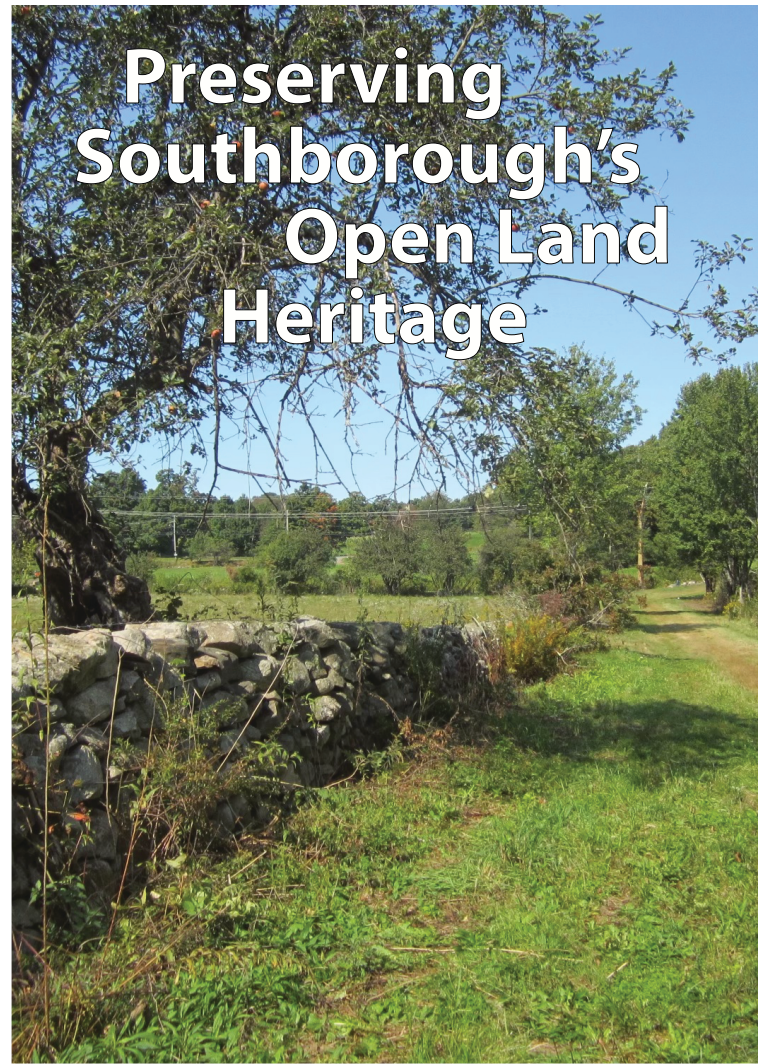

A private land trust founded in 1988, SOLF preserves and protects open space in Southborough.

What We Do

We own and manage 191 acres of open space. We also sponsor a variety of nature-based recreational and educational activities in cooperation with the Southborough Gardeners, Arts Center at Southborough, Southborough Extended Day, Boy and Girl Scouts, Southborough Recreation, and other organizations. Past events have included edible plant walks, invasive plant lectures, trail maintenance, field trips for school children, snowshoe clinics, an art show, and Earth Day clean up. SOLF also collaborates with the Town of Southborough, other land trusts, and state and federal agencies to conserve open space and promote bio-diversity.

Each year, SOLF presents the Elaine Beals Award to an individual who has made an outstanding contribution towards protecting and preserving natural spaces for all to enjoy.

Property Descriptions

- Barber Pasture**
Bridge Street. 4.4 acres of meadow and wooded area along riverside. Permission for access required.
- Beals Preserve**
Off Main Street. 56 acres of woodlands, meadows, a pond and marshes, with hiking trails.
- Big Oak Woods**
Darlene Drive. 14.3 acres of uplands and wetland habitat with a stream. Some steep grades. Notable oak trees.
- Bigelow Wildlife Refuge**
Bigelow Road. 19.4 acres, with wetland swamp and woodland and a path to a viewing platform.
- Clark Grove**
Highland Street. 0.7 acres of wooded area adjacent to the Southborough Center for the Arts. Small walking trail.
- Clear Hill Hollow**
Hillside Avenue, 10.5 acres.
- Eastbrook Farmlands**
Eastbrook Farm Lane. Two properties with 14.6 acres of low-lying former field, mostly open with some wet areas.
- Kallander Woods**
Valley Road and Boston Road. 18.3 acres. Two hillside properties with hardwoods and views of fields below. Valley Road parcel includes some wetlands.
- Lambert Corners**
Corner of Richards and Cordaville Roads. 1.5 acres of wooded area with a stream.
- Lynbrook Hollow**
Off Lynbrook Road. 5.5 acres with a small brook..
- Nipmuc Trail Woods**
Brookside Road. 2.1 acres of a mix of uplands and wetland habitat with a stream. Historic Nipmuc trail runs through property. Connects to Big Oak Woods.
- River Reserve**
Off Southville Road. 3.5 acres bordered by an old mill pond on the Sudbury River. *Boat access only.*
- Sears Reserve**
Presidential Drive. 14.3 acres, open valley views.
- Templeman Woods**
Cordaville Road. 7.7 acres of wooded upland area with glacial rock formations. Abuts town Watkins Woods. Hiking trail passes through both properties.
- Wolf Pen Pasture**
Off Sears Road. 15.2 acres with a meadow, small pond and hayfield.
